Dorsets Weekly Wonders

A new website has been launched for everyone who loves Dorset. Every Friday, dorsetswednesdaywonders.com will cover a place, building or object that helps to make up Dorset's unique appeal. The Wonders will be drawn from all over the county, from Lyme Regis to Christchurch, from Gillingham to Portland. Among the first Wonders were a traditional village cross with a modern twist, a construction that has been in place for over 700 years, and perhaps the most beautiful stretch of the river Frome.

There is a brief text about each Wonder, a photo and a location map. Over the weeks, an alphabetical index will build up that will become a guide to all the best things to see and enjoy in Dorset.
