FROM THE CHAIRMAN

There is little room for much comment from the chair in this issue. Alas, membership continues to decline, with the impact of the decision to admit ladies still to be felt, and recruitment must be a priority. We can now look forward to a full programme of events which starts with the County Dinner on 10th May, where our speakers are Michael Dooley and Angus Campbell. LYDLINCH BELLS

Although the parish church of St. Thomas a Beckett at Lydlinch has a 12th century baptismal font, the rest of the building is Perpendicular Gothic, the nave, chancel and west tower being 15th century with the north aisle and south porch added in the 16th. The tower has a peal of five bells, and the church is Grade II* listed.

Sadly, however, we learn from Sally-Anne Barrett, wife of member John, that the bells are now in need of much work, at great expense. Sally-Anne writes:

"Vor Lydlinch Bells be good vor sound" - so wrote the Dorset poet William Barnes in his poem of the same name published in 1879. The poem celebrates the distinctive sound of the Lydlinch Bells but sadly these bells are now in urgent need of restoration, which will enable them to once again be 'good vor sound' and importantly much easier to ring and echo the poem. Currently a number of potential local ringers are now being taught by members of the Mere Branch of the Salisbury Diocesan Guild of Ringers and fund raising has started to reach the target of £55,000 which is anticipated to be the final cost. It was fitting that the first donation towards this restoration came from the Society of Dorsetmen.

COMMITTEE NEWS

The Committee last met on 21st. January. The **Treasurer** reported a projected loss for 2025 of £1645, caused mainly by forced changes to the website. The **Membership Secretary** reported a nominal membership of 730, but was chasing issues with several members. Six new members, including three ladies, were admitted, but there were three deaths and five resignations. **Coming events**, the website and shop items were all discussed and are reported on elsewhere in this Newsletter. **Charitable donations** included £100 to the Echo Christmas Toy Appeal and £260 to North Dorset Women's Refuge, with a proposal to support Dorset Youths Club this year. THE LORD-LIEUTENANT OF DORSET

The Lord-Lieutenant of Dorset is a traditional and welcome guest at our County Dinner and this year is no exception as we welcome the current incumbent of the office, Michael Dooley LVO FRCOG, and his wife Barbara. For many years we have welcomed Angus Campbell CVO, now our Chairman, in this role and, to our delight, Michael and Angus will speak in conjunction.

Michael Dooley has had a long and distinguished medical career and has worked at Dorset County Hospital for over 25 years. He is Consultant Gynaecologist to the Royal Household, and practices in London and Dorset. He was lead Gynaecologist at the London Olympics, and Team Doctor for the British Equestrian Federation for eight years.



He has raised considerable sums for charities and other good causes, including the Dorset County Hospital, a local hospice and the Royal Osteoporosis Society.

Lord-Lieutenant is an honorary title given to the monarch's personal representative in a county and has carried varying tasks throughout history. They were first appointed by Henry VIII in the 1540s when the military functions of the Sheriff were transferred to him. His preset duties are numerous and include arranging visits for members of the Royal family and escorting Royal visitors, and the presentation of medals and awards on behalf of the Sovereign and advising on nominations for Honours.

PURBECK DINNER

After a break of several years, a Dinner was held at the Isle of Purbeck Golf Club on 6th March, 2025, for members and their guests. Originally held for Purbeck Area members this event fell foul of the Covid restrictions. This occasion was open to all in the hope that it will awaken sufficient interest for it to once again be a regular in the calendar.
